White or off-whte background with a purple or pink contrasting fabric. Think spring time flowers.

<u>Using 4 1/2" squares construct a churn dash block –</u> <u>finished size should be 12.5"</u>

Sewing habits develop based on several different factors such as our sewing interests, personalities, and physical space.

For some people, they work on one project at a time and finish it before starting another.

For others, it doesn't take long for unfinished projects (UFOs) to pile up.

This can be due to having a fabric stash that inspires you, getting bored or tired of working on a project, or having a new pattern/fabric/project catch your eye and you can't wait to get started on it.

Do your UFOs seem out of control? Are you so overwhelmed you aren't making progress on those much less able to focus on anything new?

In addition to documenting your UFOs on the <u>My Sewing Projects</u> <u>printable</u>, here are 10 tips to help you take action and get some (if not all) of them done in 2024.

## **10 Tips to Finishing UFOs**

- 1. Go through your UFOs and determine if you still love each one. If not, get rid of it. There is nothing wrong with not finishing something you no longer like. Donate, sell, or give it away.
- 2. Prioritize the UFOs you're keeping by what you love the most to the least. Select the top 6-12 and focus on those first.
- 3. Collect everything you need to finish each UFO (pattern, directions, fabric, thread, notions, etc.) and put it all in one container.
- 4. Clearly label the container so you can easily identify the project.
- 5. Store UFOs in one place and make sure they are visible (because out of site is out of mind).
- 6. Organize the containers in some manner (e.g. almost done to just got started; easy, medium, hard). This will make selecting a project to work on easier.
- 7. If you have multiple sewing machines, dedicate one machine to just UFOs.
- 8. Dedicate at least one day a week to work on UFOs OR work on a UFO for 15 minutes BEFORE working on a new project.

- 9. Share UFOs with a sewing/quilting buddy. (ex. Does your UFO need a binding but you hate to do them? Talk with friend and see what you can do for her and trade the projects so you can both finish.)
- 10. Form or join a UFO group either local or online. If you quilt, check out the <u>American Patchwork and Quilting UFO Challenge</u>.

#### For Sale - Fabric available at \$5 /pound

The Amherst Quilt Guild received a donation of fabric from the family of Heidi Werner, a former Home Ec teacher, sewist and quilter. As the guild has limited storage space, Kathleen Karnath agreed to accept the fabric and sell it at \$5/pound, with **all proceeds going to the Amherst Quilt Guild**. Before being advertised to the public or any other guilds, first pick of fabric is being offered to Guild members!!

There are 3 large tubs of fabric (all neatly arranged and pressed) to choose from. There are typically about 3 yards of fabric to a pound, so that equates to \$1.66/yard.
