

## Upcoming Programs by Kathleen Karnath

**July**: Designer Novi Paluch came to Buffalo in 2008 from Jakarta, Indonesia, where she worked as a trader at the Indonesian Stock Exchange. Once she had settled into Buffalo, she recognized an opportunity to start a small business selling handmade Indonesian Batik and accessories, all handmade by the elderly, special needs, and homeless youth. Starting as one of the original vendors at the West Side Bazaar, Novi offered her own clothing designs. Eventually Novi started her own boutique, Sasmita Batik (literally meaning "beautiful fabric"), where she offered a selection of hand-made Indonesian Batik, an art form and type of style she's long been familiar with. In addition to running a brickand-mortar store and selling online, Novi's fashion designs have been featured at NY's Fashion Week and this year she participated in Paris Fashion Week. A portion of Novi's business sales are used to fund homeless children's education in Indonesia. For over a decade Novi has maintained a presence not only in Buffalo's business and fashion communities, but also has stayed active with charitable causes in the Buffalo area.

Thrift store finds The textiles in your Goodwill, bag Your Grandma's linens and doilies Hankies T shirts Outgrown children's clothes Blue jeans Unconventional materials

Some techniques to think about. Just a few possibilities: Piecing traditional and non-traditional blocks Weaving Including garment features like buttons, pockets, etc. Unconventional construction

It may be possible to learn more than one during the workshop if each does not take too much time. We will have to charge workshop participants a fee – not sure what it will be yet.

## August quilt along

Join us for our annual sew along for charity on Thursday, August 22, starting at 10:30 am to 4 pm. We will meet at the Audubon Library airconditioned classroom. Bring your sewing machines (or not). We will have cutting mats, cutters, rulers, ironing boards and irons. We will bring some boxes of fabric and batting. You can use our own fabric too. Since the quilts go to Children's Hospital and Roswell Park Pediatrics, you might want to bring fabric that you have that is appropriate for children. You can use the Potato Chip quilt pattern or any pattern you wish. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=P0kbUtQrV7s&t=198s

This Potato Chip Block has many variations. The pattern provided uses 6.5 x 12.5 inch rectangles. These are big blocks and will go together quickly. You can make a quilt using whatever size rectangles you have.

The other size variations could be  $2.5 \times 4.5$  inches,  $3 \times 5.5$  inches,  $3.5 \times 6.5$  inches,  $4 \times 7.5$  inches,  $4.5 \times 8.5$  inches,  $5 \times 9.5$  inches, or  $6 \times 11.5$  inches. The finished size of the quilts should be about  $45 \times 54$  inches. A little smaller or larger is fine. Remember that there are adolescents being treated for cancer or blood disorders, too.
