Guild Meeting Notes September 19 by JoAnn Kelsch, AQG secretary

September Program:

Virtual Tour of Barn Quilts presented by Rebecca Ribis, AQG member and co chair of the Education Committee. – Rebecca provided the history of how barns have been used to display various signage that identified a farm, advertised various products, and most recently, quilt block designs. She introduced us to the American Quilt Trail Movement that started in 2001. This movement's purpose was to promote community, quilting, artists and tourism in Adams County Ohio. It's success as led to the development of similar quilt trails across the county. Rebecca's presentation included a virtual tour of barn quilts from Ohio, North Carolina, Alaska and the western New York region. – Rebecca also included local resources for barn quilt classes at The Stitchery, bike/car routes for quilt trails in the Rochester and Orleans County region and several books that provide more information about the Barn Quilt Trail Movement.

 AQG members in attendance expressed an interest in having a future Barn Quilt Block painting workshop. One of our members, Heather Buechi, offered to teach the workshop.

AccuCut – New Cart: Sally donated a new cart for the AccuCut machine and to store the cutting dies. She and her husband also constructed the special top for the cart. The guild membership in attendance agreed that the old cart could be donated to the Faith UCC (church meeting location).

Education Committee: Linda Hunter & Rebecca Ribis

- Quilting Outside the Box Workshop will be held on Saturday, Oct 5th at the Amherst Autobahn Library. Cost of the workshop cost is \$5 which will go towards the lunch. There are 2 different options: o First Track: Strip to the Beach Quilt as You Go Tote o Second Track: Kitchen Boa (morning) and Sling Bag (afternoon) o Supply lists will be sent to members who have signed up by the class instructor.

Other Topics: -

Terry Wolfe shared an assortment of quilt blocks that she and her students had made. The blocks included beautiful examples of Red-work, Sunbonnet Sue, Dresden Plate and blocks made from birdseed and flour sack fabric designs. Terry shared her "stash" with the group and offered the blocks to members for their use. AQG thanks Terry for sharing these treasures with us!

Meeting concluded with a Show and Share of items made by guild members.

Tips and Techniques Calculating Yardage for Diagonally Pieced Quilt Back

I noticed a diagonally seamed backing on a charity quilt that Sally had quilted. This prompted me to look at why and how; I found the worksheet and filed it away. The occasion to use this technique came up **today** as I was preparing a backing for a quilt my daughter and I made together. It was 49" square, so I would need 55" x 55" or a total of 3 yards to get the width and length I needed. I only had 2 ½ yards (90"). I dug out that worksheet, did the calculations and found that I could make a 55" square from 87" of 41" wide fabric. The method involves cutting the fabric diagonally from corner to corner, sliding one piece down until the combined width is the desired width (plus 1" for seam allowance), sewing that diagonal seam and then cutting off the "tails"!

The worksheet titled "Diagonally Pieced Quilt Back" is on the Jinny Beyer website. There you can fill in the first three colored boxes, and the form will do the calculations for you! Or, you can print the sheet out and do the math following the instructions.

I wouldn't necessarily use this method just for the sake of saving fabric, but it was a lifesaver in this instance! I thought I would share in case you should have a similar circumstance.
