November Program: "Frame Your Quilt: Border Techniques" by Syliva Siegel, AQG member. – Sylvia walked us through the steps of how to add borders to your quilt top. She included a trunk show of different and unique border options from her own collection and several quilts made by other guild members to include JoAnn Castiglia and Mickey Wittliff. Several of the quilts had innovative borders created from 'Round Robin' quilt projects. – Sylvia instructed the attendees on the floating flying geese border technique; she provided kits and provided instruction on how to piece this border pattern.

Sewing Class for Kids by Kathy Karnath

We are partnering with the Audubon Library to offer a sewing class for kids! The program will be held Saturday, January 11 from 1–3pm for young people 10 – 16 years old. We will be limiting class size to 10 and plan to have 3 sewing machines and 2 ironing stations with a minimum of 3 guild members. I have already made kits with flannel fabric precut to the sizes needed. Participants will have a choice of a red/black Buffalo check or (Buffalo Bills) red/white/blue plaid kit. The class will be advertised as:

Learn to Sew - Make a Pillowcase

Learn the basics of using a sewing machine from members of the Amherst Quilt Guild. You'll make your own pillowcase, using the "burrito method" (don't worry, we'll explain) from a kit provided. All supplies will be provided, just bring your enthusiasm!

Learning to sew can open a world of creativity and practicality from mending torn clothes to making your own clothes, crafts, household items and quilts!

Please let me know if you are willing to help with this class and/or let us use your sewing machine at class.

Block of the Month 12 inch Sailboat block.

Sky Fabric. 2 - 6 1/2 x3 1/2,

2- 4 inch squares,

Sail Fabric. 2- 4 inch squares.

Use the 4 inch squares from sky fabric and make half square triangles Trim to 3 1/2 inches

Boat Fabric. 1- 3 1/2 x 12 1/2 inches

Water. 1- 3 1/2 x 12 1/2 inches,

2- 3 1/2 inch squares. Sew these squares diagonally on each end of the boat as shown in the picture!

Tips and Techniques - Ensuring a Square Quilt

Having a square quilt doesn't mean that your quilt is literally square in shape, but rather that your quilt will lie perfectly flat with no puckers, tucks, or unwanted pleating after it has been quilted. Here are some helpful hints from *National Quilters Circle*.

Precision Cutting

First, be very careful when <u>cutting your fabric</u>. Precision is key! Do not use your cutting mat for measuring – it should be used as merely a surface for using the rotary cutter. You will want to invest in a quality quilting ruler such as an <u>Omnigrid</u> or similar. (I will confess that I am guilty of using my cutting board to measure...but no more.)

Ensuring a Square Quilt

Then once you have cut your fabric, you'll want to ensure <u>precision in your</u> <u>piecing</u> too. If possible, use the same sewing machine for the entire quilt as every machine has their own ¼ inch allowance. This may sound strange, but when machines are assembled they can be off ever so

slightly. If sewing on multiple machines you can end up with varying block sizes depending on the number of pieces in each block. Every time a seam is made, it can increase or decrease the size of the block depending on where the needle is coming down.

Squaring Up

The next thing you will want to do is square up your blocks once they are all pieced. You will want to be sure not to cut off any star points or flying geese points, and always leave a quarter-inch from any points so each point will be properly displayed in the finished quilt. And of course ensure that your blocks are the same size using your quilting ruler.

Sashes and Borders

A common mistake that many quilters make is neglecting to measure <u>sashing and borders</u>. Too often, quilters will take a strip of fabric and begin sewing it onto their quilt or block and then cut it when they reach the edge. Unfortunately this is not a reliable way to build your quilt. Fabric will always have some stretch to it and when applying borders or sashing you can end up with what we refer to as "wavy quilts."

The proper way to size the sashing or borders is to measure through the center of the quilt lengthwise and then again between that measurement and the edge of quilt on both sides. Then take the average of these measurements and cut borders to that length. (Do this for the width as well.)

Once cut, pin the center of the strip to the center of the side, pin the ends to the ends, and insert extra pins as needed. As you sew, be careful not to pull or tug on the fabric.
