What is slow stitching? Slow stitching encourages sewers to forget about perfection and forget about the finished article. Instead, it nurtures the idea of enjoying the process of stitching for stitching's sake.

Slow stitching is a new art form built on old traditions. The movement was originally spearheaded by Mark Lipinksi, one of the quilting industry's most well-known figures. Slow stitching is a craft where modern creativity meets ancient practices; a craft that's about the journey, not the destination. Slow stitching isn't about mending or making garments from a pattern. Neither is it about working towards a goal or a timeframe. Slow stitching is about using the needle and thread in the same way you'd use a paintbrush. It's about creating art, about enjoying the process rather than worrying about the product.

Lianne is a creative artist, a business manager and an entrepreneur. She enjoys a variety of arts, including multiple forms of fiber/fabric arts including quilting and embroidery. After discovering Slow Stitching she created an Etsy business selling beautifully packaged and beautifully curated collections of items to create a slow stitching project. Lianne will tell us about slow stitching and perhaps a bit about the business of Etsy! So join us as we take a step back from the busy, chaotic world we live in, let's appreciate the moment, take a few deep breaths, relax and stitch slowly.

Treasurer's Report: JoAnn Castiglia •

Upcoming expenses include the annual insurance, meeting facility rent and website administrator fee. The Guild's incoming funds are dependent largely on membership dues. The board discussed possible fundraising options to include an 'Opportunity Quilt' fundraiser. Sally volunteered to take the lead for the Opportunity Quilt.

Quilters Consortium NYS: JoAnn C will submit AQG membership dues for 2025. An AQG 2025 representative is needed to attend the consortium's quarterly meetings. The board will see if any of the guild members would be interested in filling this role.

Membership: Linda Hunter 2024-year end membership: 58. 2025 Membership Renewal & Dues: the membership form will be updated with Heather's information.

Education Committee: Kathy would like the guild to consider planning an educational event that will help to promote the guild. This event could also be a good fundraiser for the guild. There may be the opportunity to have a joint venture with another local guild.

2025 Monthly Meeting Locations: the January and March meetings will be at the Audubon Library. The library is not available for February so that meeting will be at Faith UCC. The board discussed the option of creating a 'Media' lead to facilitate guild communications across all formats.

Block of the Month 12 inch Sailboat block.

Sky Fabric. 2 - 6 1/2 x3 1/2,

2- 4 inch squares,

Sail Fabric. 2- 4 inch squares.

Use the 4 inch squares from sky fabric and make half square triangles Trim to 3 1/2 inches

Boat Fabric. 1- 3 1/2 x 12 1/2 inches

Water. 1- 3 1/2 x 12 1/2 inches,

2- 3 1/2 inch squares. Sew these squares diagonally on each end of the boat as shown in the picture!
