<u>February Program</u>: Faye Lone, Fiber Artist, is a member of the Seneca Nation Hawk Clan. Faye's presentation took us on an artistic journey that highlighted her unique and original creations that depict the life of indigenous people. Faye's free-motion and long-arm quilting designs portray the true heritage and history of indigenous people; she uses these fiber art compositions to teach the world and to dispel false stereotypes about Native American people and culture. <u>President's Update:</u> Kathleen Karnath, AQG President -Fabric and Quilting Books & Patterns Sale: the guild will have fabric, quilting books and patterns for sale at the monthly meetings. The funds raised will go towards the 2025 Budget's Donation Fundraising Goal of \$750. The guild is planning a bigger sale in the May or June time frame.

Monthly Meeting Time and Location: the guild meetings will take place either at the Audubon Library or at Faith UCC. Open Sew and Community Service events will continue to be held at Faith UCC; and the guild's supplies are maintained in the rental closet at the church. The meeting will begin at 6:30 regardless of the location.

March is designated as National Quilting Month and March 15th is the official National Quilting Day. Quilters are encouraged to hang/display a quilt at their homes to promote the quilting arts.

2025 Quilting Goals: Kathleen encouraged members to consider having a goal to complete a charity quilt this year.

50/50 Raffle: Sally Ginsberg introduced a new opportunity for members to participate in a 50/50 raffle that will be held at the monthly meetings. The funds raised from this activity will augment the AQG Programs budget and supplement the funds needed to cover the guild's monthly program/presentation honorariums and costs.

### AQG 2025 Challenge Quilt by Patricia Ohtake

**Make It Modern -** The 2025 Challenge Quilt theme is Modern Quilts. Members are encouraged to create a small quilt that incorporates one or more of the principles of modern quilting:

**Rules** Challenge quilts will be:

- original design
- no larger than 120" perimeter
- comprised of three layers (top, batting, and backing)
- bound and quilted through all three layers and have visible quilting by hand, by machine, or both
- made using fabrics of any color
- made using any of the following techniques: pieced, foundation pieced, English paper pieced, hand or machine appliqued, hand or machine embroidered.
